St Ayles Skiffs are 6.7m (22ft) five person coastal rowing boats



Designed by Iain Oughtred in the shape of traditional Scandinavian craft, the plywood and epoxy kits provide community building projects which share skills and get individuals out rowing just for fun and fitness and sometimes competitively.



The Skiffs are built by community volunteers with a range of skills and tools















Since 2010 there have been over 350 boats built around the world including 29 in Australia

Denmark Rowers



Denmark modeled our project on Augusta including fund raising, building facilities and involving those who wanted to row and not build.

Augusta community got behind their project and now regularly row their boats. Open to all ages, genders and ability, the project has fostered community spirit and provides a resource that strengthens their community

Current Status of the Denmark Community Rowing Association

Since the inaugural General Meeting on 1st June 2021 the Association has:

- Incorporated as a not-for-profit Association
- Opened a bank account
- Raised over \$34,000
- Purchased the kits and other materials to build two St Ayles Skiffs
- Been generously leant a shed by Harry and Kay White
- Commenced building in February 2022
- Completed St John which was launched on 5th November 2022.
- Completed Nullaki which was launched on 26th January 2023

Budget for building St Ayles Skiffs

Basic Kits from Stray Dog Boat Works plus wood costs roughly \$8,000 per boat

Two Kits: \$16,000

Insurance, utilities, tools, consumables: \$3,000

Trailers: \$8,000

Launching trolley, covers, safety equipment: \$4,000

TOTAL budget: \$31,000

Amalgamation with the Riverside Club

- Shared facilities, storage and launching
- Social and sporting hub for the community
- Sustainable infrastructure for the community




